6 Days: May 14 - 19, 2022

Day 1

Today we depart Wisconsin for our overnight accommodations in St. Louis while getting to know our fellow travelers.

Day 2 B, D

This morning we leave St. Louis for Oklahoma. Upon arrival we are treated to an evening on Iron Dog Ranch—complete with a chuckwagon dinner. This working longhorn ranch is a historical treat and there will be time to explore the grounds. There will also be time to share the knowledge and wisdom of the great Will Rogers along with some rope tricks. As the sun sets and we prepare for the Flower Moon Eclipse, singers and dancers will perform some classic hits from the musical "Oklahoma."

Day 3 B, L, D

We spend today in Pawhuska, OK, the official headquarters of the Osage Nation - a unique "Cinderella Story turned tragic" Native American tribe who became the wealthiest people in America when oil was discovered on their land in 1894. Their story is being made into a movie starring Leonardo DiCaprio and Robert DeNiro. Pawhuska is also home to the beloved Pioneer Woman. There will be time to shop and enjoy lunch from her cookbook. A tour of the Osage Nation is next on our agenda followed by the Ben Johnson Cowboy Museum and a Native Fashion Show. We end the evening with an Osage Storyteller who teaches us tribal history and we enjoy a tradition al feast and music presentation.

Day 4 B, L, D

This day's touring includes sights around **Bartlesville**, **OK**, and the discovery of oil and the magnificence of the American Bison. One of today's highlights is the **Woolaroc Museum & Wildlife Preserve**. It was the country estate of oil baron Frank Phillips. On the grounds we will find a museum with one of the world's greatest collections of western art, relics, and exhibits. You will also find an 1840's Mountain Man Camp, the Woolaroc Animal Barn, and a herd of Bison roaming across the prairie. Tonight we **celebrate with modern country music as a local band entertains us after dinner with the music of Toby Keith, Garth Brooks, and Reba McEntire**.

Day 5 B

The sun climbs over the prairie as we load onto our deluxe motorcoach and head for St. Louis for our overnight accommodations on the way home.

Day 6 B

After a spectacular week of history, music, and delicious food, we arrive home in Wisconsin with a new appreciation for the moon above us and the prairies below us.
