



Springtime in coastal virginia featuring Virginia International Tattoo April 14-20, 2024

What is a tattoo? While the word has become known for body art made with ink, the true origin of the word comes from the 17th-century tradition of military drummers alerting soldiers that it was time to return to their barracks for the evening. After hearing the call of the drums, the innkeepers would call out "Doe den tap toe!", meaning "Turn off the taps!" The "tap too" evolved over time, and the word tattoo now refers to a ceremonial performance of military music by massed bands. Since 1997, the Virginia International Tattoo has become an annual celebration of patriotism and international goodwill. The area of Norfolk, Virginia welcomes over 800 performers from all over the world in a display of bands, drill teams, massed pipes and drums, Celtic dancers, choirs, and more. It is the largest tattoo in the United States and draws audiences from around the world.

Sunday, April 14th - Grab your bags, board the motorcoach, and get ready for an exciting and entertaining trip to the shores of Virginia. Tuesday, April 16th - Following breakfast, we depart for a day exploring Richmond, the capital city of Virginia. Our **step-on guide** will give us a narrated history of the local area, including a stop at the **Virginia State Capital**. There will be time on your own to explore historic Carytown, Richmond's Mile of Style! From bookstores to candy shops, craft breweries, hot cocktail spots, and more, you will find great places to enjoy a bite to eat and some gifts to bring home. The **American Civil War Museum** is our next destination. Located in the "White House of the Confederacy," this historic landmark built in 1818 served as the executive mansion of the Confederacy during the Civil War. The museum will show legacies from multiple perspectives of the war: Union, Confederate, enslaved and free African Americans, soldiers, and civilians. We depart for dinner on your own at the **Virginia Beach Boardwalk**. Spanning over 3 miles, there is a variety of quaint outdoor restaurants and vendors. Our hotel is right off the boardwalk, so spend time enjoying the area at your own pace before returning to our hotel for the evening. **(B)**

Wednesday, April 17th - A day filled with history and shopping lies ahead of us. As it was the first stop for the English Colonists more than 400 years ago, the **First Landing Site** is where we begin our journey. Now one of Virginia's most-visited state parks, it is an oasis within the urban setting of Virginia Beach. Native American canoes, Colonial settlers, 20th century schooners, and modern cargo ships have navigated this park's waterways. Its Cyprus swamps were a source of fresh water for merchant mariners, pirates, and military ships during the war of 1812. After seeing the natural marvels of the area, it is time to experience an engineering marvel - the **Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel**. This unforgettable journey will leave you in awe as we cover over 17 miles by bridge over the Bay - without a single stop sign, traffic light, or intersection in sight. It also offers sight-seeing of vibrant wildlife and stunning views over the bay. This takes us into **Cape Charles**, where we will spend the afternoon shopping and exploring. Take time to enjoy lunch on your own at one of the many options. After an afternoon of fun, we head back to our hotel. We will have time to relax or even enjoy the boardwalk before our group goes to dinner at a local favorite featuring signature seafood options. (MEAL CHOICE NEEDED AT RESERVATION). **(B,D)**




